They were agreed at the United Nations in 2000 by global leaders. They set targets for progress on key issues, including freedom from hunger, equality for women and girls, health and shelter. CAFOD projects around the world address a range of MDGs. In Zimbabwe, for instance, high levels of malnutrition means that CAFOD is funding a food project including daily school meals for 75,000 school children.
